Overdose Alerts:

- Opioid epidemic partnering with BHA for PDMP
- Participating in Opioid Operational Command Center set up after state of emergency declared

Delegator Dashboard:

Allows delegators to manage their delegates

DEA self-audit:

• For prescribers who want to know across all patients what prescribing patterns are, or if there is an aberration in prescribing with their name. (ex. stolen prescription pad)

Overdose Alerts Overview



Purpose

- Support clinical decision making
- Provide opportunities to engage patients in a more timely manner, and to offer appropriate interventions where needed

Source of Data

Coded diagnosis data from hospitals in Maryland, D.C.
 and West Virginia used to identify suspected overdose event.




Diagnosis Codes

The patient(s) you selected may have experienced a drug-related overdose. The alerts are triggered based on coded diagnoses sent to CRISP by a subset of hospitals in Maryland, D.C. and West Virginia, so the information may not be complete. The ICD-10 codes which trigger alerts include the following, when **intentionality is accidental or undetermined**:

- T40.0X Poisoning by opium
- > T40.1X Poisoning by heroin
- > T40.2X Poisoning by other opioids
- > T40.3X Poisoning by methadone
- > T40.4X Poisoning by synthetic narcotics
- > T40.60X Poisoning by unspecified narcotics
- > T40.69X Poisoning by other narcotics
- > T42.4X Poisoning by benzodiazepines

Delegator Dashboard Overview




- > Available through the Delegator Dashboard tab in ULP
- > Available to PDMP Registered Prescribers and Pharmacists
- ➤ What is the purpose?
 - > Support the PDMP Mandate regarding Delegate access
 - > Provides Delegators the ability to manage Delegate relationships. The dashboard allows Delegator to view, edit and remove Delegates.
 - Allows for many:many relationships; a Delegate may be associated with multiple Delegators
 - Enables the Delegator to be associated with the Delegates' queries for audit history purposes. When a Delegate queries PDMP, he must select which Delegator he is querying on behalf of.

DEA Self-Audit Overview




- ➤ Available in the Unified Landing Page (ULP)
- Provides a listing of prescriptions across all patients based on prescriber's DEA number
- > Opportunity to view and understand prescribing trends
- > Audit tool for fraud concerns, such as missing Rx pad
- > Can only be run by user to see own history
